Have you heard about Libby? The free app for your phone or tablet gives you access to over 60,000 eBooks, eMagazines, and audiobooks to checkout. The titles are current, popular, and ever-expanding. Do you wish you could borrow a physical book? You're in luck...introducing Curbside Checkout! The Blytheville, Manila, and Osceola branches will be offering book pickup during special hours (listed below). Call and request a book during call-in hours and pick it up later that day during pickup hours. In order to maintain social distancing standards, please follow these guidelines:

- Return books in designated drop-off areas and do not hand them directly to staff. All books will be quarantined for 72 hours and mylar covers will be wiped down with a bleach solution before they are checked in and returned to circulation. Thank you for your patience as we do our best to keep our collection virus-free!
- Call to let us know you've arrived and we'll put your books by the door, or even carry them to your trunk! Please do not request new books or information during pickup. We miss seeing you, too, but hope that maintaining distance now will keep us all healthy!

- **Osceola Library**, Monday-Friday: Call-in hours 12-1, Pickup hours 2-3. 870-563-2721
